CHILD INTERNET SAFETY EAST AYRSHIRE CPC POSITION STATEMENT

Staff in Community Learning and Development have undertaken multi agency training on internet safety.

Internet safety training has been provided to parents at some primary schools.

Training and delivery of Internet Safety has been deemed a priority for Youth Workers and Tutors.

Internet safety posters have been displayed in Learning Centres.

Young People using Learning Centres have been issued with 'smart cards' to them to possible dangers when using the Internet.

Residential staff and foster carers have been provided with guidance in relation to their responsibility to monitor and supervise use of computers by children and young people in their care.

Residential staff and foster carers have been provided with training on the issue provided on a multi agency basis by Strathclyde Police.

Written advice has been provided to all foster carers and included in their handbook.

Leaflets on internet safety and cyber bullying have been provided for use by carers and young people.

The Council's IT Team has developed restricted access to the internet arrangements for computers situated within children's houses.
