## **EAST AYRSHIRE VOLUNTEER CENTRE**

### **Report by Executive Director of Educational and Social Services**

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1** The purpose of this report is to advise Cabinet of the grant application for 2008/9 from the Volunteer Centre and to make recommendations accordingly.

#### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1** The Volunteer Centre East Ayrshire (previously known as East Ayrshire Local Volunteer Development Agency) was established in October 2000 by a group of local organisations to promote and develop volunteering throughout East Ayrshire.

- 2.2** The overall aims and objectives include:

- the promotion and development of volunteering within East Ayrshire
- the recruitment and referral of volunteers to agencies
- the contribution to the development and delivery of support and training for volunteers
- the promotion of good practice in recruiting, training, placing and supporting volunteers and volunteer engagers.

- 2.3** In financial year 2007/8 the Council awarded a grant of £11,275 subject to other funding being secured.

#### **3. GRANT REQUESTED 2008/9**

- 3.1** The grant requested for 2008/9 is £15,000. The Volunteer Centre has a good history of attracting external funding. The undernoted funding sources have been applied for in financial year 2008/9:

- Scottish Executive £100,000

- 3.2** The Volunteer Centre continues to support volunteering in East Ayrshire. The number of volunteers supported as at 31 March 2008 was 413. The number of young people volunteering was 148. These figures are an increase from last year of 286 volunteers and 120 young people. The Centre has had a particular focus on supporting voluntary organisations to register with the Scottish Criminal Records Bureau. At a strategic level, the Volunteer Centre is an active member of the Community Learning and Development Partnership.

- 3.3** Based on the information from the grant application it is recommended by the assessing Department that a grant of £12,000 is awarded.

#### **4. FINANCIAL/ LEGAL/POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

4.1 There is sufficient funding to support the recommendation contained in this report.
