COMMUNITY GRANTS TO LOCAL ORGANISATIONS 2010/2011

1. There was submitted a report dated 3 August 2010 (circulated) by the Executive Director of Finance and Corporate Support on the financial position in respect of Community Grants to Local Organisations in 2010/2011 together with individual assessment reports (circulated) in respect of the undernoted applications.

The Committee agreed as follows:-

(a) Community Councils

Gatehead Community Council (CG 4652) – to continue the application to the next meeting in order that the Committee receive information as to the numbers attending the trip.

(b) Community Safety

(i) East Ayrshire North Crime Prevention Panel (CG 4637) – The Administrative Officer advised that the organisation had applied for funding to assist with the cost of the Annual Crime Prevention School Quiz. The total project costs were £600.00 with a Community Grant sought of £200.00. The Application was cross boundary. A membership list was awaited. The Committee agreed to award up to £200.00, in principle, subject to receiving a satisfactory assessment and that payment of the grant be delegated to the Head of Democratic Services in consultation with the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee.

(c) Leisure Activities

(i) Kilmarnock and Loudoun Ramblers Association (CG 4651) - £120.00.

(d) Older People

(i) Evergreen Club (CG 4598) – The Administrative Officer advised that the group had applied for funding for (i) an annual trip to Stirling and (ii) fees for hire of hall and kitchen. The total cost of the project was £970.00 with a Community Grant award sought of £770.00. The application was cross boundary. The Committee agreed to award up to £107.80, in principle, subject to receiving a satisfactory assessment and that payment of the Grant be delegated to the Head of Democratic Services in consultation with the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee.
