DISBURSEMENT OF COMMUNITY GRANTS 2008/2009

Report by the Depute Chief Executive/Executive Director of Corporate Support

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To enable the Committee to consider and deal with applications for Community Grants received from local organisations in respect of the 2008/2009 financial year.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 The Interim Southern Local Grants Committee on 21 February 2008 homologated arrangements implemented to enable applications for Community Grants received from local organisations in respect of the 2008/2009 financial year to be dealt with. Such arrangements provide that applications from organisations within Wards 7 & 8 (former Cumnock Area Local Committee area) and Ward 9 (former Doon Valley Local Committee area) will be dealt with separately in accordance with the different approaches of the former Local Committees and within separate budget headings allocated from the total sum awarded to the Committee for this year. Applications from organisations within Ward 9 will be dealt with on a "first come, first served" basis whilst applications from organisations within Wards 7 & 8 are to be dealt with on an annual basis at the start of the financial year.
- 2.2 A report submitted to this meeting under a previous item sets out the financial allocation available to this Committee for Community Grants for 2008/2009, and also the split of this allocation between Wards 7 & 8 and Ward 9.

3. GRANT ALLOCATION FOR 2008/2009

- 3.1 As indicated in the report referred to in Paragraph 2.2, above, the financial allocation available to this Committee for Community Grants for the current year amounts to £81,953 (Wards 7 & 8 - £54,937) and Ward 9 (£27,016). There is currently no carry forward of monies from previous years for either Wards 7 & 8 or Ward 9, however, a sum of £3.00 has been added to the allocation for Wards 7 & 8 arising from an accounting exercise undertaken by the Finance Section. **(Recommendation 13.1(i)).**

4. GENERAL APPROACH

- 4.1 It is suggested that the Committee firstly deal with applications from organisations within Ward 9 followed by applications from organisations within Wards 7 & 8, all as presented in Sections 5 & 6, below.

5. APPLICATIONS FROM ORGANISATIONS WITHIN WARD 9

- 5.1 A statement dated 30 April 2008 by the Depute Chief Executive/Executive Director of Corporate Support on the financial position in respect of outstanding applications for Community Grants received from organisations within Ward 9 is provided at Appendix 1 and individual assessment reports relative to the applications concerned are provided at Appendix 2. It should be noted that all applications presented for consideration for Ward 9 are cross-boundary applications with Wards 7 & 8, there being no applications which relate exclusively to Ward 9. **(Recommendation 13.1(ii)).**

6. APPLICATIONS FROM ORGANISATIONS WITHIN WARDS 7 & 8

6.1 Present Position

- 6.1.1 All administrative arrangements arising from the Committee's decisions relating to the processing of applications for 2008/2009 have been implemented. As at 15 February 2008, being the specified closing date, 73 applications for Community Grant had been received. A further 8 applications were received following the closing date, giving an overall total of 81 applications received. Of these, 3 applications have subsequently been withdrawn, leaving 78 outstanding applications. Those applications received after the closing date are detailed in Appendix 3.

- 6.1.2 A spreadsheet detailing the financial position with regard to the applications received, classified according to the established categories, is attached at Appendix 4.

- 6.1.3 Grant assessment reports which provide details of each individual application received from organisations within Wards 7 & 8, and put forward recommendations as to how each application should be dealt with, are attached at Appendix 5. **Members should note that it is the "Final Recommendation" contained within Section 7 of the grant assessment report, which is submitted for consideration by the Committee. The "Final Recommendation" takes into account not only the individual merits of the application in question but also the financial allocation which is available for disbursement within each respective category (as previously determined by Committee).**

6.2 Late Applications

- 6.2.1 The Committee are invited to determine whether those applications which were received after the closing date of 15 February 2008, should be accepted. To assist in this matter, provided at Appendix 3, is a list of the applications concerned indicating the date of receipt and the reason(s) for lateness of submission. **(Recommendation 13.1(iii)(a)).**

- 6.2.2 **It should be noted that the recommendations presented within Appendix 4 are made on the basis of all late applications being accepted.** If it should be the case that any of these applications are to be refused on the

basis of lateness of submission, the recommended amounts will then be added to the uncommitted balance referred to in Paragraph 6.3.1, below.

6.3 Disbursement of Uncommitted Balance 2008/2009

6.3.1 With regard to the current uncommitted balance identified in Appendix 4, i.e. £2,852.71, it is suggested that this sum be available to the Committee (a) to allocate to any application, irrespective of category, which the Committee considers would merit an award in excess of the amount recommended; and/or (b) to set aside to enable applications for grant which might be received during the year, to be dealt with, or in respect of emergency applications. **(Recommendation 13.1(iii)(b)).**

6.3.2 The funds available for disbursement under this heading would be augmented in the event that the Committee agree an award of a lesser amount than recommended in respect of any of the applications submitted.

6.4 Determination of Applications

6.4.1 Having considered the matters referred to in Paragraphs 6.2 and 6.3, above, the Committee are asked to consider and determine the individual applications detailed in Appendix 5. **(Recommendation 13.1(iii)(c)).**

7. COMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THE COMMUNITY GRANTS SCHEME

7.1 In order to assist in ensuring that all organisations who apply for grant assistance meet the requirements of the Community Grants Scheme, it is suggested that any approved grant payments be issued only where the organisation concerned has (a) submitted all documentation relative to the application, and this has been found to be satisfactory; (b) submitted a satisfactory report, with appropriate documentary evidence, to confirm use of any grant awards made in previous years; and (c) provided evidence to confirm that, where appropriate, all requisite permissions have been obtained for the project which is the subject of the application. **(Recommendation 13.1(iv)).**

8. PRIORITISATION OF COMMUNITY GRANT APPLICATIONS WITHIN WARDS 7 AND 8

8.1 Within Wards 7 & 8, the priority weightings to be afforded to each of the identified grant categories, i.e. the percentage of the annual grant budget to be allocated to each category, were determined by the former Cumnock Area Local Committee in 2005 and have now, therefore, been effective for 3 years. The percentages allocated to each category are identified in the category headings within Appendix 4, and these percentages were based upon historic demand patterns during the 4 years preceding implementation.

8.2 It is suggested that it would now be appropriate for Officers to review the priority weightings to be afforded to each of the identified categories to take

account of changing patterns of demand, e.g. initial indications are that there is now a greater relative demand for grant funding for leisure, sport and cultural purposes and a lower relative demand for disability purposes. In addition, a review would allow the Committee the opportunity to highlight those categories or types of organisation which it is felt should be afforded greater priority compared to others, and all of these factors would feature in a report back to this Committee for consideration prior to arrangements being put in place to deal with applications for the next, 2009/2010, financial year. **(Recommendation 13.1(v)).**

9. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

9.1 The cost of Community Grant awards made will require to be met from the financial allocation available for 2008/2009 as detailed in Section 3.1, above.

10. LEGAL/POLICY IMPLICATIONS

10.1 There are no legal/policy implications arising directly from this report.

11. COMMUNITY PLAN

11.1 The disbursement of Community Grants to a range of locally based organisations complements the main themes of the East Ayrshire Community Plan.

12. RISK IMPLICATIONS

12.1 Failure to timeously disburse Community Grants may compromise the activities/projects proposed by applicants for grant funding.

13. RECOMMENDATIONS

13.1 It is recommended that the Committee:-

- (i) note that a total sum of £81,956.00 is available to the Committee for disbursement on Community Grants for the 2008/2009 year (Wards 7 & 8 - £54,940.00; and Ward 9 - £27,016.00) **(PARA 3.1)**;
- (ii) consider and deal with those applications submitted from organisations within Ward 9, as detailed in Appendix 2 **(PARA 5.1)**;
- (iii) with regard to applications from organisations within Wards 7 & 8:-
 - (a) consider whether those applications received after the closing date of 15 February 2008 should be accepted **(PARA 6.2.1)**;
 - (b) notwithstanding the outcome of consideration of individual applications, agree that the currently uncommitted balance identified in Appendix 4 be disbursed as suggested in Paragraph 6.3.1 **(PARA 6.3.1)**;

- (c) determine the individual applications detailed in Appendix 5 **(PARA 6.4.1)**;
- (iv) agree that grant awards approved by the Committee be paid only where the applicant satisfies the various requirements set out in Paragraph 7.1 **(PARA 7.1)**; and
- (v) for Wards 7 & 8, remit to Officers to review, and report back to a future meeting on, the priority weightings to be afforded to each of the identified categories, and in this connection, indicate any preferences which the Committee would wish to see taken into account in determination of the weightings **(PARA 8.2)**.
