### **SOUTHERN LOCAL GRANTS COMMITTEE - 19 MAY 2011**

#### **DISBURSEMENT OF COMMUNITY GRANTS 2011/2012 - WARDS 7 & 8 (CUMNOCK AREA)**

##### **Report by the Executive Director of Finance and Corporate Support**

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 To enable the Committee to consider and deal with applications for Community Grants received from local organisations within Wards 7 & 8 (Cumnock Area) in respect of the 2011/2012 financial year.

#### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 The Interim Southern Local Grants Committee on 21 February 2008 homologated arrangements implemented to enable applications for Community Grants received from local organisations to be dealt with. Such arrangements provide that applications from organisations within Wards 7 and 8 (Cumnock Area) and Ward 9 (Doon Valley) be dealt with separately and within separate budget headings allocated from the total sum awarded to the Committee for the financial year in question. In accordance with these arrangements, applications from organisations within Wards 7 and 8 are to be dealt with on an annual basis at the start of the financial year.
- 2.2 A report submitted to this meeting under a previous item sets out the financial allocation available to this Committee for Community Grants for 2011/2012, and also the split of this allocation between Wards 7 & 8 (Cumnock Area) and Ward 9 (Doon Valley).

#### **3. GRANT ALLOCATION FOR 2011/2012**

- 3.1 As indicated in the report referred to in Paragraph 2.2, above, the financial allocation available to this Committee for the current, 2011/2012, year, amounts to £78,341.00. Of this, a sum of £53,264.00 has been allocated in respect of Wards 7 & 8.

#### **4. APPLICATIONS RECEIVED**

- 4.1 All administrative arrangements arising from the Committee's decisions relating to the processing of applications have been implemented in respect of applications received for the 2011/2012 year. As at 11 February 2011, being the specified closing date, 64 applications for Community Grant had been received. A further 8 applications were received following the closing date, giving an overall total of 72 applications received, one of which has been withdrawn.

- 4.2 A spreadsheet detailing the financial position with regard to the applications received, classified according to the established categories, is attached at Appendix 1. Members will note from the spreadsheet, that the value of grant applications submitted amounts to £169,064.70 (taking no account of cross boundary elements).

## 5. PRESENT POSITION

- 5.1 Grant assessment reports which provide details of each individual application received from organisations within Wards 7 & 8, and put forward recommendations as to how each application should be dealt with, are attached at Appendix 2. **Members should note that it is the “Final Recommendation” contained within Section 7 of the grant assessment report, which is submitted for consideration by the Committee. The “Final Recommendation” takes into account not only the individual merits of the application in question but also the financial allocation which is available for disbursement within each respective category, as previously determined by Committee.**
- 5.2 Some applications for grant are jointly for running costs and other activities such as a trip or party. In these cases, and whilst recognising that the use of any grant award made lies at the discretion of the organisation concerned within the purposes set out within the grant application form, it is recommended that it be suggested to the organisations concerned that priority in the use of community grant funding be directed towards the running costs element of the application. It is suggested that this approach is appropriate given the limited funding available compared to the values of the applications applied for, particularly with regard to certain categories of grant.

## 6. LATE APPLICATIONS

- 6.1 The Committee are invited to determine whether those applications which were received after the closing date of 11 February 2011, should be accepted. To assist in this matter, provided at Appendix 3, is a list of the applications concerned indicating the date of receipt and the reason(s) for lateness of submission, where this information has been provided.
- 6.2 **It should be noted that the recommendations presented within Appendix 2 are made on the basis of all late applications being accepted.** If it should be the case that any of these applications are to be refused on the basis of the lateness of submission, the recommended amounts will then be added to the uncommitted balance referred to in Paragraph 7.1, below.

## 7. DISBURSEMENT OF UNCOMMITTED BALANCE 2011/12

- 7.1 With regard to the currently uncommitted balance identified in Appendix 1, i.e. £1,719.00 it is suggested that this sum be available to the Committee (a) to allocate to any application, irrespective of category, which the Committee considers would merit an award in excess of the amount recommended; and/or (b) to set aside to enable applications for grant which might be

received during the year from newly formed organisations, to be dealt with, or in respect of emergency applications. As in previous years, it is suggested that “emergency applications” be defined as those applications in respect of which the lack of a grant award would significantly prejudice the continuing existence of the organisation concerned.

- 7.2** The funds available for disbursement under this heading would be augmented in the event that the Committee agree an award of a lesser amount than recommended in respect of any of the applications submitted.

## **8. DETERMINATION OF APPLICATIONS**

- 8.1** Having considered the matters referred to in Sections 6 and 7, above, the Committee are asked to consider and determine the individual applications detailed in Appendix 2.

- 8.2** With regard to applications from Older People’s organisations, this Committee on 27 May 2010 agreed that for the 2010/2011 financial year, awards be made on a per capita basis at the rate of £5.00 per head, up to a maximum of the amount of grant requested subject to consideration being given to awarding additional funding in respect of those applications on the basis of merit. Subsequently, on 10 September 2010, the Committee approved additional grant awards to three organisations within the Older People’s category, having considered requests from these organisations for additional grant funding.

- 8.3** With regard to grant applications from Young People’s organisations, in respect of running costs, this Committee on 27 May 2010, agreed that awards be made on a per capita basis at the rate of £5.00 per head, up to a maximum of the amount of grant requested, subject to adjustment in light of further examination by the Committee of the particular merits of each individual application.

- 8.4** The “Final Recommendations” contained within each of the assessment reports at Appendix 2 reflect the decisions of the Committee referred to in Paragraphs 8.2 and 8.3, above, with respect to the per capita arrangements, and the Committee have further discretion regarding the awarding of additional funding in respect of applications from Older People’s organisations and Young People’s organisations for running costs, on the basis of the particular merits of each individual application. It should be noted that the ‘Final Recommendations’ in respect of grant awards to Older People’s Organisations for 2011/2012 are based on a per capita rate of £4.00, which reflects the percentage of the total financial allocation available for this category.

## **9. COMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS OF THE COMMUNITY GRANTS SCHEME**

- 9.1** In order to assist in ensuring that all organisations which apply for grant assistance meet the requirements of the Community Grants Scheme, it is

suggested that any approved grant payments be issued only where the organisation concerned has (a) submitted all documentation relative to the application, and this has been found to be satisfactory; (b) submitted a satisfactory report, with appropriate documentary evidence, to confirm use of any grant awards made in previous years; and (c) provided evidence to confirm that, where appropriate, all requisite permissions have been obtained for the project which is the subject of the application.

## **10. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

**10.1** The cost of Community Grant awards made will require to be met from the financial allocation available for 2011/2012 as detailed in Section 3.1, above.

## **11. LEGAL/POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

**11.1** There are no legal/policy implications arising directly from this report.

## **12. COMMUNITY PLANNING IMPLICATIONS**

**12.1** The disbursement of Community Grants to a range of locally based organisations complements the main themes of the East Ayrshire Community Plan.

## **13. RISK IMPLICATIONS**

**13.1** Failure to timeously disburse Community Grants may compromise the activities/projects proposed by applicants for grant funding.

## **14. RECOMMENDATIONS**

**14.1** It is recommended that the Committee:-

- (i) note that a total sum of £53,264.00 is available to the Committee for disbursement on Community Grants for the 2011/2012 year for applications received from organisations within Wards 7 & 8;
- (ii) consider whether those applications received after the closing date of 11 February 2011 should be accepted;
- (iii) notwithstanding the outcome of consideration of individual applications, agree that the currently uncommitted balance identified in Appendix 1, be utilised for the purposes suggested in Paragraph 7.1;
- (iv) determine individual applications detailed in Appendix 2, and agree that where an application includes a running costs element, it be suggested to the organisation concerned that priority in the use of the grant funding be used for this purpose; and

- (v) agree that grant awards approved by the Committee be paid only where the applicant satisfies the various requirements set out in Paragraph 9.1.
