RETURN OF GRANT MONIES - RICCARTON CO-OPERATIVE WOMEN'S GUILD (CG 3356) (Item 11, Page 2353, 03/07)

It was reported by the Administrative Officer and noted, that Riccarton Co-operative Women's Guild had returned a total sum of £90.00 to the Council in respect of the Community Grant award made for an outing and a visit to the Scottish Parliament, of which £13.50 was returned to Kilmarnock Central Local Committee.

PROGRESS REPORT IN RESPECT OF BONNYTON GOLDEN AGE (CG 33257 (Item 11, Page 2187, 03/07)

7. It was reported by the Administrative Officer and noted, that the Group had received a total cross-boundary grant award of £610.00 (the Kilmarnock Central Local Committee's award being £472.75) to assist with the cost of an annual outing.
