- 1. LOCAL GOVERNANCE (SCOTLAND) ACT 2004 - REVIEW OF ELECTORAL ARRANGEMENTS: STAGE 3 (pages 1-12)** - Submit report dated 5 May 2005 (copy enclosed) by the Chief Executive to submit for consideration of Council (i) the Local Government Boundary Commission's initial proposals for nine multi-member wards within East Ayrshire; and (ii) the recommendations of the Council's Member/Officer Working Group on Review of Ward Boundaries in respect of the Boundary Commission's initial proposals and suggested ward names.
