DISBURSEMENT OF COMMUNITY GRANTS 2005/2006

Report by the Depute Chief Executive/Executive Director of Corporate Support

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To enable the Committee to consider and deal with applications for community grant received from local organisations in respect of the 2005/2006 financial year.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 This Committee on 31 January 2002 agreed a number of matters in relation to the general arrangements for dealing with applications for community grants for future financial years. An extract of the Minute of the Local Committee meeting of 31 January 2002, which details the matters determined by the Committee is attached (Appendix 1), for ease of reference.

- 2.2 At subsequent meetings, the Committee also agreed, namely:-

- on 26 June 2003, that, in future, per capita grant awards to Older People's organisations be made in respect of "social and recreational activities" rather than "Summer and Christmas activities" in order to reflect more accurately the purposes for which many of the organisations concerned apply for grant;
- on 6 November 2003, that, in future, the nominal closing date for the submission of Community Grant applications from local organisations be 14 February each year; and
- on 6 November 2003, that potential applicants be made aware that grant awards in respect of late applications will be considered in extenuating circumstances only.

- 2.3 Proposals for the allocation of Community Grant funding to all Local Committees is the subject of a report to Council on 28 April 2005 and final allocations will be determined at that meeting.

3. PRESENT POSITION

- 3.1 All administrative arrangements required arising from the Local Committee's decisions relating to the processing of applications have been implemented. As at 11 February 2005, being the specified closing date, 73 applications for community grant from local organisations had been received. A further 12 applications were received following the closing date, giving an overall total of

85 applications received. Those applications which were received after the closing date are detailed in Appendix 2.

- 3.2 A statement summarising the value of applications received, on the basis of recommendations by the Assessing Departments, classified according to the established categories, is attached at Appendix 3.
- 3.3 Grant assessment reports which provide details of each individual application received and put forward recommendations as to how each application should be dealt with are attached at Appendix 4. Members should note that it is the "Final Recommendation" contained within Section 6 of the Grant Assessment form which is submitted for consideration by the Committee. The "Final Recommendation" takes into account not only the individual merits of the application in question but also (i) the level of funding which could be made available in respect of the application having regard to the overall financial allocation which the Local Committee has available for disbursement for Community Grants for the current financial year; and (ii) opportunities which it is considered exist for organisations to seek funding from other sources.
- 3.4 Notwithstanding the two stage process referred to above which was undertaken to determine the "Final Recommendation" relative to each application, and from the indicative sums detailed in the report to Council it is anticipated that the total value of grant recommendations will still exceed the available allocation. The Officers concerned have been unable to determine further reductions in respect of individual applications on any reasoned basis and, accordingly, it is suggested that the most equitable and reasonable way of ensuring that the total value of recommendations meets the available allocation, is to reduce the amount of the recommendation relative to each individual application, excluding applications from Older People's Groups for social and recreational purposes, by an appropriate percentage.

4. MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

- 4.1 In order to facilitate arrangements for dealing with applications for community grant for 2005/2006, and prior to dealing with individual applications, the Committee are invited to consider the undernoted matters, namely:-

- (a) Late Applications

It is suggested that the Committee, prior to considering individual applications, as referred to in Paragraph 4.2, below, should firstly determine whether the applications for grant which were received after the closing date of 11 February 2005 should be accepted.

In the past the Committee have indicated a willingness to accept those applications received on the Monday following the specified closing date, i.e. for this year this would be Monday 14 February 2005, in recognition that there may be reasons outwith the control of the applicant for the slight lateness of submission. It is suggested that the Committee may wish to continue this approach, however, in respect of

those applications received after 14 February 2005, the reason(s) for this as indicated by the applicant is detailed in Appendix 2.

It should be noted that the recommendations and other information contained within the Appendices attached to this report have been prepared on the basis of all late applications being accepted by the Committee. Should it be the case that some or all of the late applications are not to be accepted then the monies allocated to these groups would then be available for disbursement in respect of other applications.

(b) *Applications Received During the Remainder of the Financial Year 2004/2005*

The Committee are asked to determine whether a portion of the financial allocation available for community grants for the current financial year should be set aside to enable applications for grant which might be received during the year from organisations formed during the year or in respect of emergency applications, to be dealt with. The "Final Recommendations" relative to each application are made on the basis that no amount is set aside for this purpose.

(c) *Young People's Uniformed Organisations*

Having regard to the decision on 31 January 2002 (Appendix 1), the Committee is asked to determine the formula upon which grants will be made to young people's uniformed organisations in respect of general operating costs.

The Committee is reminded that for the 2004/2005 year, payments were as follows, namely:- less than 20 members - £60; 20-40 members - £70; and more than 40 members - £80.

The Committee have also agreed to consider applications which might be submitted by such organisations in respect of specific projects, events etc.

(d) *Older People's Organisations: Level of Grant Awards*

Having regard to the decision on 31 January 2002 (Appendix 1), the Committee are asked to determine the rate at which the per capita element of grant awards to Older People's Organisations should be made.

To assist the Committee in this matter, attached at Appendix 5 is a list of Older People's Organisations which have applied for grant funding for this purpose; the Assessing Department's recommendations as to the grant awards in each case, based on assessments of the applications on a merit basis; and the amount of grant which each organisation could be awarded based on different per capita rates.

The Members are reminded that the total per capita rate for last year was £3.50 plus supplementary grant awards at the rate of 15p per head, paid in April 2005. It has also previously been agreed that in addition any further award of grant would be determined on the individual merits of each application and having regard to the amount of the per capita award. It is suggested that the value of any further grants awarded on merit basis should not exceed the amount of the recommended grant when added to the per capita element.

The Officers' recommendation is that grants to the Older People's Organisations for 2005/2006 should be at a per capita rate of £3.35, and the final recommendations relative to other applications have been prepared on this basis.

- 4.2** Having determined the matters referred to in 4.1 (a)-(d) above, the Committee are asked to consider and determine the individual applications detailed in Appendix 4.
- 4.3** In order to assist in ensuring that all organisations who apply for grant assistance meet the requirements of the Community Grants Scheme, it is suggested that the approved grant payments be issued only when the organisation concerned has (a) submitted all supporting documentation relative to the application, and this has been found to be satisfactory; (b) submitted a satisfactory report, with appropriate documentary evidence to confirm use of any grant award made during the 2004/2005 year; and (c) provided evidence to confirm that, where appropriate, insurance cover is in place, and any requisite permissions have been obtained for the project which is the subject of the application.

5. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1** Any community grant awarded will require to be met from the total financial allocation for 2005/2006.

6. LEGAL/POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 6.1** None arising directly from this report.

7. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 7.1** It is recommended that the Committee consider and deal with those matters identified in Paragraphs 4.1, 4.2 and 4.3 of this report.

APPENDIX 1

EXCERPT FROM CUMNOCK AREA LOCAL COMMITTEE - 31 JANUARY 2002

DISBURSEMENT OF COMMUNITY GRANTS

7. There was submitted a report dated 14 January 2002 (circulated) by the Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources to enable the Committee to consider arrangements for the submission of, and dealing with, applications for Community Grants during the 2002/2003 and subsequent financial years.

It was agreed:-

- (i) that, in general, the arrangements for the submission of, and dealing with, applications for Community Grants during the 2002/2003 and subsequent financial years be as undernoted, namely:-

Closing Date for Applications - local organisations will require to submit applications, irrespective of when the Group's proposed activity/event is due to take place, no later than 31 March each year, in order to enable applications received by the due date to be assessed and considered by the Local Committee at a Special Meeting to be held as soon as possible following commencement of the new financial year;

Notification of Arrangements - in order to facilitate the submission of applications by local groups, the Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources will arrange (a) for those organisations which had applied for Community Grant funding during the previous year to be advised directly of the arrangements for applying for the forthcoming year and to be issued with a grant application form; (b) for posters to be displayed at Council premises advising of the arrangements; and (c) for one advertisement to be placed in the local press;

Applications from Older People's Groups for Summer and Christmas Activities -

- (a) applications will be considered from any Older People's Group; and
(b) in cases where a grant award is to be made in respect of an application submitted, such awards will be made partly on a per capita basis according to membership numbers and, where appropriate, partly having regard to the individual merits of each application;

Hanging Basket Projects and Gala Days - applications for grant in respect of hanging basket projects and Gala Days will be dealt with each on their individual merits;

Young People's Uniformed Organisations - applications for grants from Young People's Uniformed Organisations will be dealt with as follows, namely:- (a) where appropriate, grants will be made in respect of general operating costs according to membership numbers on a formula basis to be determined; and (b) additionally, consideration will be given to awarding grants to these

organisations for project specific purposes, each application in this case to be dealt with on its individual merits;

- (ii) that it be remitted to the Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources, after consultation with the Chair, to implement the detailed arrangements each year; and
- (iii) to note that the Committee may, at any time in the future, amend the arrangements referred to in (i) and (ii) above, insofar as might be considered appropriate.
