1.	<p>Community Representative Julie Quinn indicated that she had fallen from her electric wheelchair as a result of an uneven and sloping pavement adjacent to Broomhill Hotel, London Road, and Kilmarnock and asked that the defect be inspected and repaired.</p>	<p>Brian Weadon, Area Roads Engineer North confirmed that the footway would be investigated and a response made to the Community Representative.</p>	<p>The site has been inspected; extensive work is required to re-grade footway.</p> <p>Hope to programme works this financial year and advised J Quinn by letter.</p>
2.	<p>Community Representative Archie Pryce requested to be kept informed of progress of repairs to the Youthie Project building at St Joseph's Academy, Kilmarnock.</p> <p>Also requested that computer courses be provided for local residents at St Joseph's Academy and that these are well publicised.</p> <p>Reassurance was sought that support would be given to the Youthie Project Management Committee to access funding and develop the project further.</p>	<p>Janice Harrison, Team Leader, Community Learning and Development confirmed that the Community Representative would be kept informed of progress of the repairs, that the request for computer training would be followed up and a commitment given to support the Youthie Project to develop.</p>	<p>The repairs to the Youthie Project's premises have been advised to Education Property section to be progressed.</p> <p>The Community Worker is awaiting permission from the school to host the requested computer courses.</p> <p>Support to the project is ongoing.</p>
3.	<p>Community Representative Charles McGowan advised that a marker post (right-hand-side) required re-instatement at the speed bump at the entrance to Thorn Terrace from Amlaird Road; that a dog fouling bin required to be reinstated at Thorn Terrace end of lane running from Meiklewood Road to Thorn Terrace and a litter bin provided at Thorn Terrace Playpark.</p>	<p>Brian Weadon, Area Roads Engineer North confirmed that the marker post would be re-instated and the Administrative Officer has passed the dog fouling and litter bin enquiries on to Malcolm Rae, Area Operations Manager North, Cleansing Service and a response will be made to the Community Representative.</p>	<p>The marker post was reinstated but subsequently damaged.</p> <p>Confirm that the bollard was fully concreted into place 19 February and trust that it will now remain in the correct position and advised C McGowan by letter.</p>
