Amount requested - £3,315.50

Breakdown:

1. Training Equipment

The club have been sent an affiliation and grant aid form for East Ayrshire Sports Council. The Sports Council has an equipment strand to its grant aid programme.

- 3. Tour of England &**
- 4. Minibus Hire**

Although there are benefits associated with travelling to compete in matches, the assessor is of the opinion that as much benefit could be derived from local clubs & organisations. To this end, the club have been sent details of how to contact East Ayrshire's Football Development Officer based at Kilmarnock FC.

The cost associated with both of the above tours and the hire of the minibus is £2,909.50, with 19 people (16 participants and 3 coaches) benefiting from the grant, this cost translates to approximately £153 per head.

If the local committees contribute £1,000 towards the cost of the project the amount per head would reduce to £50. The club should then be encouraged to fundraise in order to meet the remaining costs.

Other Grants from East Ayrshire Council

In the grant application form the group indicated that they had not received grant aid from East Ayrshire Council in the past 24 months. A similar indication was given during a phone call with the assessing officer. However, in the groups financial statement they have listed £3,000 as "Grant from Council under their income section.
