2006 SCOTTISH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION

Report by Acting Executive Director of Development and Property Services

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise members of the results of the 2006 Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation (SIMD 2006) and to highlight key results from its analysis as they relate to East Ayrshire.

2. BACKGROUND

2.1 The SIMD is the Scottish Executive's official tool for identifying small area concentrations of multiple deprivation across all of Scotland. The SIMD provides a relative ranking of 6,505 small areas (termed data zones) across Scotland from the most deprived (ranked 1) to the least deprived in Scotland (ranked 6,505) and is based on an analysis of detailed information of indicators grouped under various 'domains'. The 2006 domains are current income, employment, health, education, geographic access, housing and crime. A report outlining the results of the 2004 SIMD was presented to Committee in September 2004.

3. CONSTRUCTION OF THE SIMD 2006

3.1 Although boundaries for the data zones for the 2006 index remain unchanged there are differences in the construction of the 2006 index over the 2004 index. This makes direct comparison with the 2004 results difficult. Strictly speaking because of adjustments in methodology and data sources between 2004 and 2006 the final results for the 2 years are not directly comparable. Nevertheless for information purposes some basic comparisons are provided in this report but they need to be interpreted with great care.

3.2 The most significant difference over the 2004 SIMD is that the 2006 index contains more 'domains' and indicators. Each domain represents a different subject area or theme and consists of a number of indicators which have been chosen to efficiently capture deprivation for that domain area. The SIMD 2006 contains seven domains and 37 indicators compared with the SIMD 2004 which contained six domains and 31 indicators. A full list of the domains and indicators for the SIMD 2006 is provided in appendix 5.

3.3 The new 2006 domain relates to crime. The crime domain contains indicators prepared for each data zone which provide the rate per 10,000 population for selected crimes of violence, domestic housebreaking, vandalism, drug offences and minor assault. It should also be noted that a new public transport sub domain in the geographic access to services domain has also been added.

3.4 Other very technical adjustments as to how the indicators are constructed have also been made. In addition the data sources have been updated and adjusted to reflect current or most recent circumstances (e.g. eligibility for and availability of various benefit payments which may not have been government policy when the data for the 2004 SIMD was gathered). Most importantly although the geographical boundaries of the data zones have remained unchanged the population size, gender or age distributions (which are used in many instances to calculate the indicator scores) may have changed.

3.5 The index is calculated by combining the scores for each domain for each data zone using a weighting which gives more consideration to those domains/indicators which are considered to have a greater impact on deprivation. The weights applied to each of the domains are as follows: current income 12 (28%), employment 12 (28%), health 6 (14%), education 6 (14%), geographic access 4 (9%), housing 1 (2%), and crime 2 (5%).

However in interpreting the results it is important to note that

- Changes in the rank of a data zone do not necessarily imply absolute change in that area, merely relative change in the overall Scottish context. Absolute change in some areas may cause a relative change in the rank of other data zones that have not undergone absolute change.
- The SIMD is a relative measure of deprivation and can not be used to determine how much more deprived one data zone is than another. Average ranks cannot be used.
- The SIMD does not measure affluence as the indicators used are selected to measure deprivation such as receipt of benefits. Data zones with high ranks are not necessarily affluent but simply less deprived.
- The SIMD is not a measure of, or a tool for tackling individual deprivation as not all deprived individuals live in areas identified as having a high level of multiple deprivation. Conversely, not all people living in deprived areas are deprived themselves.

- The number of data zones varies considerably between local authority areas as does the size of the population which needs to be considered in making comparisons between areas.
- The 15% cut off is used by the Scottish Executive to define areas with the highest concentrations of multiple deprivation and has been chosen as the distribution of deprivation from most to least deprived begins to shallow after the 15% most deprived data zone marker is reached. The most deprived 15% include data zones from 1 to 976.
- Data zones do not match ward boundaries.

4. EAST AYRSHIRE SIMD 2006 RESULTS

4.1 To provide a better understanding of the national context within which deprivation within East Ayrshire should be understood an analysis of the top 15% most deprived zones in the overall SIMD for 2004 and 2006 has been made and is shown in appendix 1. Table 1 shows that the proportion of East Ayrshire's population defined as deprived in a relative sense has declined from 18.85% in 2004 to 17.99% in 2006. Table 1 also shows that East Ayrshire has the eighth largest proportion of its population categorised as deprived as opposed to sixth in 2004. Table 2 of appendix 1 shows the proportion of data zones within all categories in East Ayrshire for the SIMD 2004 and 2006.

4.2 The distribution of the most deprived data zones within East Ayrshire based on the SIMD for 2004 and 2006 is given in appendix 2. These tables confirm that there are two types of deprivation in East Ayrshire with a similar level of population in each – one has a distinctive urban character similar to that found elsewhere in Scotland's towns and cities and the other has a rural and dispersed character located primarily within the former coalfield in the southern part of the Council's area.

4.3 Although the SIMD 2004 and SIMD 2006 is not directly comparable for the reasons given above the employment domain is the exception as the indicators have not changed. As such direct absolute comparisons can be made between 2004 and 2006. Appendix 3 shows the actual level of unemployment in the top 15% deprived data zones in the SIMD for 2004 and 2006 in East Ayrshire. This type of analysis can be completed for all data zones in East Ayrshire but it is too early to draw trend conclusions on the basis of 2 sets of results shown. It is hoped that in future years a more detailed analysis of unemployment trends at data zone level can be completed but this will depend on the same indicators being retained for the 2008 SIMD in the employment domain.

4.4 Appendix 4 gives, for information purposes, a summarised analysis of the spread of data zones by rank throughout East Ayrshire. Maps highlighting the spatial distribution of data zones within the top 2006 30% deprived using the categories contained in East Ayrshire's Regeneration Outcome Agreement submission in August 2005 are available through the Implementation Officer.

5. COMMUNITY PLAN/POLICY IMPLICATIONS

5.1 The Community Plan is the sovereign strategic planning document for the delivery of public services in East Ayrshire. The above and further more detailed analyses of the SIMD 2006 results will be essential to informing the review of the Community Plan.

6. LEGAL/FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

6.1 There are no legal implications directly arising from this report.

7. RECOMMENDATION

7.1 It is recommended that the committee

- (i) note the summarised results of the 2006 SIMD.**

Current Income Domain

- Number of adults (all) receiving Job Seekers Allowance
- Number of children (aged 0-15) dependent on recipient of Job Seekers Allowance

Employment Domain

- Unemployment Claimant Count averaged over 12 months, men aged under 65 and women aged under 60
- Incapacity Benefit recipients, men aged under 65 and women aged under 60
- Severe Disablement Allowance recipients, men aged under 65 and women aged under 60
- Compulsory New Deal participants – New Deal for the under 25s and New Deal for the 25+ not included in the unemployment claimant count

Health Domain

- Standardised mortality ratio
- Hospital episodes related to alcohol use
- Hospital episodes related to drug use
- Comparative illness factor
- Emergency admissions to hospital
- Proportion of population being prescribed drugs for anxiety, depression or psychosis
- Proportion of live singleton birth of low birth weight

Education, Skills and Training Domain

- School pupil absences
- Pupil performance on SQA at stage 4
- Working age people with no qualifications (2001 census)
- 17-21 year olds enrolling in higher education
- People aged 16-18 not in full time education

Geographic Access to Services Domain

- Drive time to a GP
- Drive time to a petrol station
- Drive time to a post office
- Drive time to shopping facilities
- Drive time to a secondary school

Geographic Access to Services Domain (continued)

- Public transport time to a GP
- Public transport time to a post office
- Public transport time to shopping facilities

Housing Domain

- Persons in households that are overcrowded
