#### **EAST AYRSHIRE VOLUNTEER CENTRE**

##### **Report by Executive Director of Educational and Social Services**

### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1** The purpose of this report is to advise Policy and Resources Committee of the grant application for 2006/7 from the Volunteer Centre and to make recommendations accordingly.

### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1** The Volunteer Centre East Ayrshire (previously known as East Ayrshire Local Volunteer Development Agency) was established in October 2000 by a group of local organisations to promote and develop volunteering throughout East Ayrshire.
- 2.2** The overall aims and objectives include:
- the promotion and development of volunteering within East Ayrshire
  - the recruitment and referral of volunteers to agencies
  - the contribution to the development and delivery of support and training for volunteers
  - the promotion of good practice in recruiting, training, placing and supporting volunteers and volunteer engagers.
- 2.3** In financial year 2005/6 the Council awarded a grant of £10,789 subject to other funding being secured. This was in addition to £11,000 through Community Regeneration Funding.

### **3. GRANT REQUESTED 2006/7**

- 3.1** The grant requested for 2006/7 is £11,000. The Volunteer Centre has a good history of attracting external funding. The undernoted funding sources have been secured in financial year 2006/7:
- Scottish Executive £69,660
  - Millennium Volunteers £23,000
  - Community Regeneration Funding £11,000
- 3.2** The Volunteer Centre continues to achieve its targets. The number of volunteers supported as at 31 March 2006 was 302. This was an increase from 280 at 31 March 2005. The number of young people volunteering increased from 90 to 185 in the same time period.

**3.3** Based on the information from the grant application and Community Regeneration Grant Fund Project Monitoring Form it is recommended by the assessing Department that a grant of £11,000 is awarded.
