**APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF LICENCE TO KEEP A DOG BREEDING
AND REARING ESTABLISHMENT AT WATERSIDE FARM,
GLASGOW ROAD, GALSTON**

1. There was submitted a report dated 6 August 2002 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services which invited the Panel to consider an application for the grant of a licence to operate a Dog Breeding and Rearing Establishment.

Councillor Carmichael, seconded by Councillor Menzies moved that the application for a licence to operate a Dog Breeding and Rearing Establishment be granted subject to the standard conditions, together with the following additional conditions: (a) that the licence will not be issued, and will therefore not become effective, until the applicant has obtained all the necessary planning consent, including Building Warrant and Listed Building consent to enable him to carry out the works specified as being required by the Council's appointed Veterinary Surgeon and the Environmental Health Service; and (b) that all works and procedures specified by the Council's appointed Veterinary Surgeon and the Environmental Health Service shall be completed within a period of three months from the date of issue of the licence.

Councillor Weir, seconded by Councillor Wilson moved as an amendment that the application for licence to operate a Dog Breeding and Rearing Establishment be refused.

On a division by a show of hands, there were 5 votes for the motion and 5 votes for the amendment. There being an equality of votes, the Chair exercised her casting vote in favour of the motion.

The meeting terminated at 1028 hours.
