1.1 Declarations of Interest

1.2 Consideration of Item

There was submitted a report dated 7 August 2003 (circulated) by the Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources which requested consideration of an application from the Robert Burns World Federation Ltd for drinks at their Conference and Annual General Meeting to take place in the Park Hotel, Kilmarnock on Friday 12 September 2003.

Having noted that the reference to the Laigh Church should be the Laigh West High Church it was agreed:

- (i) to approve the request from the Robert Burns World Federation Ltd to provide after-dinner liqueurs at their Conference and Annual General Meeting; and
- (ii) to remit the necessary arrangements to the Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources, in consultation with the Chair.

**BOUNDARY COMMISSION FOR SCOTLAND - FIFTH PERIODICAL REVIEW OF
PARLIAMENTARY CONSTITUENCIES - SCOTLAND**

2. There was submitted a report dated 11 August 2003 (circulated) by the Chief Executive which informed the Committee of the Boundary Commission for Scotland's revised recommendations for East Ayrshire Council area, North Ayrshire Council area and South Ayrshire Council area and asked the Committee to consider whether to make any further representations to the Commission.

It was agreed:

- (i) that the Head of Administrative and Legal Services write to the Boundary Commission for Scotland suggesting that the proposed Parliamentary Constituency, as revised, of "Kilmarnock and Loudoun" be renamed "Kilmarnock, Loudoun and Auchinleck"; and
- (ii) otherwise to note the contents of the report.
