STRATHCLYDE POLICE SPOTLIGHT REPORT

Report by the Chief Inspector

1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To advise the Local Committee of Spotlight activity and other crime trends.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 Agreement was reached between the Council and the local Police Commanders to provide information on Spotlight and crime matters affecting local communities.

3. SPOTLIGHTS

- 3.1 The Spotlight in connection with Safer Streets continues and due to its success has been extended until the end of the year. From October to December 2000, the other seven Scottish Forces will take part and the Initiative will be known as Safer Scotland.
- 3.2 On Friday 28 July, there was a Special Initiative Force Spotlight which gave Divisions the autonomy to target areas that were of particular concern to them. Officers from Cumnock, supported by additional staff from Divisional Headquarters, Kilmarnock, targeted the Doon Valley area concentrating on licensed premises, drinking in public and disorder issues.
- 3.3 This resulted in 24 visits to licensed premises, one person reported for possession of an offensive weapon, one person for drinking in a public place and one person for a breach of the peace.
- 3.4 Although difficult to quantify the level of crime prevented, there were no incidents of disorder during the Spotlight in the Doon Valley area.
- 3.5 On 14 and 15 July, a local Spotlight in Auchinleck was held targeting offensive weapons as well as quality of life issues such as disorder and vandalism. Over the two nights, 12 visits to licensed premises were carried out and 96 persons searched for offensive weapons or drugs. This resulted in four persons being reported for Misuse of Drugs Act offences, two apprehensions four outstanding warrants and one apprehension for a Breach of the Peace. There were no reports of disorder or violence during the hours of the Spotlight.

3.6 A further Mini-Spotlight was carried out in the Catrine area targeting drinking in public between 10.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. on Friday 4 August until Saturday 6 August. Twelve visits were made to licensed premises by high-profile patrols. No offences were detected.

4. CRIME TRENDS

4.1 Crime figures for the first quarter of the financial year show an increase in crime of 18% from 689 to 815. However, these figures also incorporate a large number of drug offences detected (85) at the Homelands Festival held at New Cumnock on 24 June 2000. The detection rate for this period was an excellent 62.9%, well above the Force average. Crimes of dishonesty have increased by 14.3% up from 377 to 440 and violent crime has increased by 2% up from 48 crimes to 49.

4.2 To date, July statistics are not available, but a verbal update will be given at the meeting.

5. PRO-ACTIVITY

5.1 During the first quarter, Officers based in the area searched 150 persons for drugs and 755 persons for weapons. They also visited licensed premises on 283 occasions.

5.2 Further, during the first quarter, local officers dealt with 307 offences of which 164 were disorder related as well as 204 detected road traffic offences.

6. RECOMMENDATION

6.1 The Local Committee are asked to note the report.
