The society was founded in January 1997 to study and promote family history. The work includes, programme of speakers, research, study visits and workshops.

## 2 Purpose of the grant

The Society has started work on a series of monumental inscription booklets targeting church yards and cemeteries which have not previously been recorded. This is a good resource for people studying their family history. The Society are planning to record inscriptions and publish booklets for the graveyards in the Doon Valley – Dalmellington, Dalrymple and Patna. 100 booklets will be published and copies will be given free to East Ayrshire Libraries. The total cost of the Doon Valley project is £585, comprising of Printing and publication costs, administration and travel costs.
