MATTER RAISED	ACTION TO BE TAKEN
Councillor McDill spoke about the recent fatality on the A71, and queried whether a safety survey could be carried out to identify blackspots and to try and improve road safety.	Pass copy of request to Transportation Section and CC. To Councillor McDill.
Cllr MacLean spoke about the poor state of white lining in Galston on the junction of Sorn Road/Wallace Street and a number of other junctions.	Pass copy of problem to Roads Section to investigate and respond and CC. to Councillor MacLean.
A number of points were raised by Community Representative Mr G Dalziel on the imposition of the £1 charge for council tax payments at post offices, and the Council bringing forward payments dates to the 1st of the month.	Douglas Campbell answered all points at the meeting but agreed to investigate and respond to Mr Dalziel on whether East Ayrshire Council is the only Council in Scotland not to absorb the £1 charge levied by Girobank. Advise Mr Dalziel of this course of action.
Community Representative S Brown raised the lack of consultation on the reduced opening hours of Newmilns Local Office and implications for payment of council tax.	Noted that the Community Council had already written to the Chief Executive on this subject which was currently being investigated with a response forthcoming.
Bill Pattison highlighted on behalf of Galston Community Council the state of the derelict Council yard in Henrietta Street, Galston.	Pass copy of problem to Director of Development Services. Letter to Bill Pattison informing of this course of action.
Councillor Wilson queried the length of time taken to progress works towards re-opening Windyhill Bridge, Newmilns	Noted.
