QUESTIONS ARISING FROM 15 MINUTE QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION

MATTER RAISED	ACTION TO BE TAKEN
Named Substitute, Jessie Graham raised several matters in relation to housing repairs:- (i) queried the length of time it takes to carry out housing repairs (cited individual repair); (ii) queried the renovations being carried out in Blair Avenue, Hurlford. Alleged that other areas in Hurlford more in need; (iii) intimated request from tenants in Hurlford for half re-decorating allowance in vouchers and the other half in money.	Re (i) pass on to Director of Homes and Technical Services to contact Jessie Graham for details of this repair; (ii) noted at meeting that Chair had requested address specific list of properties to be renovated in his ward and would provide Jessie Graham with a copy when available; (iii) pass request to Director of Homes and Technical Services for investigation and response to Jessie Graham.
Community Representative, Bill Pattison unhappy with level of street sweeping in front of former Co-op building in Brewland Street, Galston.	Refer this matter to Director of Community Services for investigation and response to Bill Pattison.
Bill Pattison requested update on his request for a report re usage/training for CCTV cameras.	Noted offer by Director of Community Services to visit Kilmarnock Police Office to view monitoring arrangements in due course, which would also allow the operation of the new camera in Hurlford to be viewed. Noted report thereafter by Police Liaison Officer, Hugh Mitchell, advising of the success of Scottish Executive Challenge Bid Funding which would upgrade the Galston system to a live link to the Kilmarnock Police Office
