### **NAMING OF STREETS BY LOCAL COMMITTEES - DEVELOPMENT AT DARVEL ROAD, NEWMILNS**

#### **Report by Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources**

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 To request the Committee to consider a name for a street within a new development at Darvel Road, Newmilns.

#### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 The Decentralisation Sub-Committee of the Policy and Resources Committee, at its meeting on 4 June 1996, agreed that the naming of streets be included within the remit of Local Committees.
- 2.2 Section 97 of the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 gives authority to East Ayrshire Council in relation to naming of streets and the preparation of house numbers etc.
- 2.3 The Local Member, Councillor Harry Wilson, and Newmilns and Greenholm Community Council have been informed of the development and requested to put forward suggestions on the name of the street to this Committee.

#### **3. CURRENT POSITION**

- 3.1 Councillor Harry Wilson has suggested the name Spoolers Wynd.
- 3.2 Newmilns and Greenholm Community Council has suggested the name Mill Court.
