<b>MATTER RAISED</b>	<b>ACTION TO BE TAKEN</b>
Mr McIvor raised the issue of speeding in Gatehead, despite the speed limit signs. He had been advised by the Police to take a note of the Registration number and report it to them.	The Director of Community Services would feedback through the Traffic Department and the Roads Department and would request the presence of the Police at the Community Council's public meeting on 11 September 2000 at 1930 hours in the Community Centre.
Back gardens at the corner of 135 Fairlie View is repeatedly flooded by water off the road during heavy rain.	This issue is to be raised with the Director of Homes and Technical Services and the Head of Roads and Transportation.
John Donaldson raised concern about the early closure/Sunday closure of the public toilets at the Bus Station.	The Director of Community Services responded to this concern.
Concern was raised about the lack of continuity in relation to Police attendance at Community Council meetings.	Answered by Dep, SDO, Strathclyde Police.
James McClymont raised concern that taxis did not honour pre-booked calls, particularly after midnight on Fridays and Saturdays.	The Director of Community Services will raise informally with taxi companies.
The Chair raised concern about the damage to the wall at the Kay Park, Kilmarnock.	The Director of Community Services explained that temporary measures had been taken and he was looking for suggestions for long-term use of the memorial at the Kay Park.
Jean Dunlop raised point that family want to lease the empty hairdressers unit at Bonnyton but there is local resistance to carry-out restaurant on this site.	Explanation given that planning permission would be required for a change of use at this site.
