MATTERS RAISED UNDER THE 15 MINUTE QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION

	<u>MATTER RAISED</u>	<u>RESPONSE/ACTION TO BE TAKEN</u>
1.	Street Lighting - Maureen Brown raised issue that Glasgow City Council were replacing sodium lighting with brighter white lights in an attempt to reduce crime and asked if East Ayrshire Council could look into this proposal.	Administrative Officer to refer to Director of Development Services to investigate the matter and respond direct to the Community Representative.
2.	Applying for Lottery Funding - Maureen Brown raised the issue that Mike Watson, MSP, had announced £87m Lottery Funding and enquired if East Ayrshire Council would be applying for funding.	The Chair indicated that the Council had appointed an External Funding Officer with a remit to maximise use of external funding. Accordingly, the enquiry would be passed on to the External Funding Officer to respond direct to the respondent with examples of maximising funding from external sources.
3.	Nazareth House - Older Person's Residential Home - Matt Donnelly raised issue of its closure and enquired if East Ayrshire Council had any involvement.	The Chair confirmed that the facility was not in Council ownership and had no involvement.
4.	Sturrock Street, Kilmarnock - Request for Speed Reduction Measures - Archie McKenzie was concerned about the speed of traffic at Sturrock Street presenting a danger to Kilmarnock Academy school pupils crossing the busy road.	Administrative Officer to refer issue to Director of Development Services to clarify road safety measures at this location.
