Peggy Shaw (on behalf of Anne McRoberts)	<u>Trees at Caprington Avenue</u> Arising from previous requests for work to be carried out on the trees at the above location, Peggy Shaw clarified that the intention of the original request had been that broken branches be removed from the trees and not for them to be pruned.	The Outdoor Amenities Manager (Robert McCulloch) advised that he would arrange for the trees to be assessed and make the necessary arrangements for work to be carried out, whilst ensuring that no damage was caused to the trees.
Peggy Shaw (on behalf of Anne McRoberts)	<u>Flooding - Central Avenue</u> It was reported that there had been a flooding problem at Central Avenue where the shops are located following the recent introduction of traffic calming within the area.	Neil Bell advised that further drainage work had still to be carried out and that this should resolve the problem.
Winnie Campbell	<u>Low-line Buses (Stagecoach)</u> Concern was expressed that Stagecoach had had to take their low-line buses off certain routes in the Kilmarnock South area due to pavement heights in specific areas.	Neil Bell advised that he would investigate this matter and take appropriate action.
Peggy Shaw (on behalf of Anne McRoberts)	<u>Grass-cutting</u> Concern was expressed that grass-cuttings were not cleared-up following cutting by Grounds Maintenance staff.	The Outdoor Amenities Manager (Robert McCulloch) advised that the contract specification for grass-cutting included clearing-up grass-cuttings and that this was done throughout the Kilmarnock area.
Councillor Darnbrough	<u>Road Diversion Signs</u> It was reported that there were a number of road diversion signs which were lying around the Kilmarnock South area following recent road works and it was requested that this matter be investigated.	Neil Bell advised that he would investigate this matter and take appropriate action.
