Margaret Shaw	<p><b><u>Flooding - Central Avenue</u></b></p> <p>It was reported that there was still a flooding problem at Central Avenue.</p>	<p>Councillor Darnbrough reported that the measures which had been introduced to resolve the flooding problem at Central Avenue had been working. However, it was understood that the drain may have become blocked, but in any event, the Roads Section were continuing to deal with the matter.</p>
Joan Wark	<p><b><u>Marchdyke Crescent - Carparking</u></b></p> <p>Reference was made to the number of vehicles parked at Marchdyke Crescent and a request made that consideration be given to tarmacing the grassed area there to provide a parking facility for residents.</p>	<p>Councillor Knapp reported that parking was a continuing problem as a result of an increasing number of vehicles. However, he stated that it was not simply a case of removing grass and putting down tar to provide a parking area but that such a proposal would have to be considered on a Council wide basis. In any event, the owners of the area of ground in question would have to be established.</p>
Winnie Campbell	<p><b><u>Motorbikes - landscaped areas - Loreny Drive</u></b></p> <p>Concern was expressed regarding reports of individuals riding motorbikes along the landscaped areas around Loreny Drive and Marchdyke Crescent.</p>	<p>Superintendent Thomson and Sergeant Richmond noted the Community Representatives concern and undertook to investigate the matter.</p>
John Timpany	<p><b><u>Grass verges - Bellfield</u></b></p> <p>Concern was expressed that grass was not being removed from the verges at the Mormon Church in Bellfield when grass cutting has been carried out.</p>	<p>Councillor Knapp advised that this would require to be addressed as a Council-wide issue.</p>
