#### **AUCHINLECK INDOOR BOWLING CLUB**

##### **Report by the Director of Corporate Resources**

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 The purpose of the report is to request that the Sub-Committee consider an application from Auchinleck Indoor Bowling Club to provide a civic lunch to be held on Sunday 18 March 2001.

#### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 Auchinleck Indoor Bowling Club will be holding major bowling events between 18<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2001 as follows:-
- 18/19 March 2001 - the British Isles Ladies Bowling Championships involving teams from Scotland, England, Ireland, Wales and (for the first time in Scotland) the Channel Islands; and
  - 20/22 March 2001 - the Homes International Series, which includes teams from Scotland, England, Ireland and Wales.
- 2.2 The Club are applying for civic hospitality in the form of a civic lunch for approximately 30 people which would include 20 British Isles officials, representatives of the Bowling Club and 5 representatives from East Ayrshire Council.
- 2.3 The Department of Community Services are also supplying the Club with assistance in kind in the form of decorative chains and two-way radios.
- 2.4 The Club have requested the use of the former Primary School in Well Road, Auchinleck for car parking facilities and have been advised that the premises are currently being marketed by the Council and hope to be sold in the near future. However, if the premises are not sold by the time the events take place then they would be available for use.

#### **3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 3.1 This is the first application for civic hospitality from the Club. The total cost of the civic lunch is approximately £200.

**5.1** To consider the request from Auchinleck Indoor Bowling Club for civic hospitality.
