#### **THE SCOTTISH HUMAN RIGHTS CENTRE – REQUEST FOR GRANT**

##### **Report by Depute Chief Executive/Director of Corporate Resources**

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 To provide members with information in relation to the grant application made to the Council from the Scottish Human Rights Centre, and to make recommendation accordingly.

#### **2. BACKGROUND**

- 2.1 The Scottish Human Rights Centre was founded in 1970 and works closely with Local Councillors, MSP's, MP's, statutory bodies and community voluntary organisations, to promote human rights in Scotland through research, advice and public education.
- 2.2 The Scottish Human Rights Centre has received three previous awards from East Ayrshire Council: 1998/1999 - £1,200, 1999/2000 - £1,200 and 2000/2001 - £1,200.

#### **3. GRANT REQUESTED**

- 3.1 The purpose of the current application is to contribute to the overall running costs of the Scottish Human Rights Centre. The organisation offers a free service, which provides equality of opportunity to all citizens, many of whom have exhausted assistance from all other agencies. In particular, their service is targeted at individuals who have suffered extreme disadvantage as a result of lack of assistance, disability or as a member of a minority group.
- 3.2 The total cost of the project is £82,000. East Ayrshire Council's application is part of a number of submissions to other local authorities. The specific request to East Ayrshire Council is for £1,420.
- 3.3 The assessing officer recommends £1,200, which is in line with previous awards.

#### **4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

- 4.1 The recommended grant can be met from existing budgets.
