**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY SHEET**

**1. DEVELOPMENT DESCRIPTION**

1.1 Listed Building Consent is sought for the replacement of one timber window on the rear extension. It is proposed to replace the existing top hung timber window with a top hung uPVC window.

**2. RECOMMENDATION**

**2.1 It is recommended that the application be approved.**

**3. SUMMARY OF ANALYSIS**

3.1 In terms of the East Ayrshire Local Plan, Finalised Version and the Design Guidance of the Finalised Cumnock and Doon Valley District Wide Local Plan, the proposed development conflicts with the provisions of policies contained therein. Furthermore, the proposal is contrary to the guidance given in the Memorandum of Guidance on Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas 1998 and the Architectural Heritage Society have objected the use of UPVC in this Listed Building.

3.2 However as the existing window is a timber casement window on a rear extension, it is considered that it is of little merit to the building itself or to Ochiltree Conservation Area. It is also considered that the use of uPVC in this instance, given the location of the window, is acceptable.

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APPLICATION BY MRS MCCURDIE****Report by Head of Planning and Building Control****1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1.1 The purpose of this report is to present for determination a Listed Building Consent application which is to be considered by the Local Planning Committee under the scheme of delegation as the proposal is subject to objection and contrary to policy.

**2. APPLICATION DETAILS**

2.1 **Site Description:** The application site is located on the north side of Main Street Ochiltree and forms part of a row of single storey terraced cottages. There is a small extension (approximately 16 square metres) to the rear of the dwellinghouse. This extension has a slate roof and timber casement windows. The front of the dwellinghouse, which faces onto Main Street, has timber sash and case windows.

2.2 The existing dwellinghouse forms part of a Category B group listed building with the other terraced cottages. The dwellinghouse also lies within Ochiltree Conservation Area.

2.3 **Proposed Development:** Listed Building Consent is sought for the replacement of one timber window on the rear extension. It is proposed to replace the existing top hung timber window with a top hung uPVC window.

**3. CONSULTATIONS AND ISSUES RAISED**

3.1 Ochiltree Community Council has not responded to the consultation letter.

***Noted.***

3.2 The Architectural Heritage Society of Scotland have objected to the application. Although this is to the rear of the building, a traditional timber window would be more in keeping with this charming building. They would

not like this to be the thin end of the wedge, which would see the replacement of all the windows in the house with such an unsuitable material.

***The installation of windows constructed of UPVC is normally considered inappropriate in a Listed Building and detrimental to the character of the building. In this instance however, as the rear extension is not visible from the Main Street, and is only visible from a distance (approximately 23 metres) from the nearest public road, Broom Crescent, it is considered that the proposal would not be detrimental to the visual amenity of this B listed Group or Ochiltree Conservation Area.***

#### 4. REPRESENTATIONS

4.1 The Architectural Heritage Society of Scotland has objected to the proposed development, as outlined in Section 3.2 of the Report.

#### 5. DEVELOPMENT PLAN STATUS

5.1 The relevant policy document is the East Ayrshire Local Plan, Finalised Version. Built Heritage Policy ENV4 states that the Council will seek to ensure that all development within or affecting the setting of a Conservation Area or affecting the appearance of setting of a Listed Building, is sympathetic to the area or building concerned in terms of its layout, size, scale, design, siting, materials and colour of finish. Wherever possible, all proposals should seek to preserve, enhance or incorporate features, which contribute positively to the character or appearance of the area and have due regard to the architectural and historic qualities of the area or building concerned.

***In terms of materials to be used, the proposal is not considered sympathetic to the provisions of this policy.***

5.2 Design Guidance for the East Ayrshire Local Plan has yet to be agreed. The relevant design guidance is therefore contained within the Finalised Cumnock and Doon Valley District Wide Local Plan. Appendix 17 of the Finalised Plan lists development control policy documents, one of which relates to Listed Buildings and Buildings within Conservation Areas. There are specific policies regarding replacement windows which state that:-

- (i) all replacement windows must be of traditional design and have traditional methods of opening;
- (ii) all replacement windows must be of timber construction with window frames being painted in colours to be agreed with the Planning Authority;
- (iii) all replacement windows must reflect the style and proportion of original windows being replaced. In particular the proportion of top-to-bottom sashes and the pattern of glazing bars and astragals must be retained and

reproduced;

(iv) all replacement windows on the front elevation of listed buildings or on other elevations which are open to view must meet the criteria above. Only in exceptional cases where it can be reasonably justified will consideration be given to the use of UPVC or aluminium windows and only then if the windows are located on elevations of the building which are not readily visible. In all cases, windows that are proposed in non-traditional materials must still be of traditional style and design.

***The proposed replacement window would fail to meet all of the above criteria and would therefore be contrary to the Design Guidance. However, given that the rear elevation is not clearly visible from public view and the window to be replaced is not an original or of traditional design, it is considered that although it is contrary to policy, the proposal is acceptable and an exception to policy can be made in this instance.***

## **6. OTHER PLANNING CONSIDERATIONS**

6.1 Historic Scotland's 'Memorandum of Guidance on Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas, 1998' gives detailed advice on consideration of Listed Building Consent cases. Paragraph 1.2.4 states that modern substitutes for timber windows should be firmly discouraged. Paragraph 1.2.11 further states that the damage which may be caused by the replacement of the window, which is historically and architecturally correct, with a modern unit made from a different material, to a different design or with a different method of opening is potentially immense. Any proposal which will result in the diminution of architectural quality, no matter how small, should be refused.

***The rear elevation is not clearly visible from public view and the window to be replaced is not an original or of traditional design, it is therefore considered that the proposal is acceptable.***

6.2 Should the Committee be minded to approve the listed building consent application, it will not require to be forwarded to the Scottish Minister for a final decision as the property is a Category B group listed building.

## **7. FINANCIAL AND LEGAL IMPLICATIONS**

7.1 There are no financial or legal implications for the Council in the determination of this application.

## **8. CONCLUSIONS**

8.1 In terms of the East Ayrshire Local Plan, Finalised Version and the Design Guidance of the Finalised Cumnock and Doon Valley District Wide Local Plan, the proposed development conflicts with the provisions of policies contained therein. Furthermore, the proposal is contrary to the guidance given in the Memorandum of Guidance on Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas 1998 and the Architectural Heritage Society have objected the use of UPVC in this Listed Building.

8.2 However as the existing window is a timber casement window on a rear extension, it is considered that it is of little merit to the building itself or to Ochiltree Conservation Area. It is also considered that the use of uPVC in this instance, given the location of the window, is acceptable.

## **9. RECOMMENDATION**

**9.1 It is recommended that the application be approved.**
