**JOINT FUNDING OF SCOTTISH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION COMMUNITY
OFFICER (BASED AT KILMARNOCK FOOTBALL CLUB)**

1. There was submitted a report dated 31 October 1996 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services requesting consideration of the continuation of joint funding of the Scottish Football Association Football Community Officer who, based at Rugby Park, would promote football development in East Ayrshire.

It was agreed:-

- (i) to approve, in principle, funding up to the amount of £5,000 for the Football Community Officer scheme; and
- (ii) that it be remitted to the Director of Community Services to take account of this decision in the budget process for 1997/98.

CHARGES FOR INTERNET BROWSING AND PC HIRE

2. There was submitted a report dated 5 November 1996 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services recommending the establishment of a charging framework for internet and P.C. services within the Library Services Section of the Department of Community Services, to be implemented with effect from 1 December 1996.

It was agreed:-

- (i) to approve the following charges:-
 - Internet Browsing/P.C. Hire (Standard Rate) - £5 per hour and £2.50 per half hour
 - Internet Browsing/P.C. Hire (Concessions) - £4 per hour and £2 per half hour
 - Diskettes £1 each
 - Paper (per sheet) - 2p.

- (ii) that the usage and charging structure for this new service be monitored and reviewed after six months; and
- (iii) that the Director of Community Services as part of the above review investigate the possibility of restricting access to pornographic and other undesirable material available via the internet.

GRANTS TO VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS SCHEME: AWARD TO BANDS

3. There was submitted a report dated 30 October 1996 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services requesting consideration of grant applications which had been received from Kilmarnock Pipe Band and Ayrshire Clarinet Choir.

It was agreed:-

- (i) to approve the payment of grants as undernoted:-
 - (a) Ayrshire Clarinet Choir - £500; and
 - (b) Kilmarnock Pipe Band - £900; and
- (ii) that in future the Director of Community Services should provide more detailed information in respect of the organisation's activities and current financial position in reports on applications submitted under the Grants to Voluntary Organisation's Scheme.

The meeting terminated at 1125 hours.
