CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATIONS

2.1 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A STREET TRADER'S LICENCE: PAUL RANKIN, 29 MOORBURN ROAD, LARGS

There was submitted a report dated 15 December 1997 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for grant of a Street Trader's Licence.

Having considered a letter of representation dated 18 November 1997 from Strathclyde Police (circulated) it was agreed to grant the licence subject to the standard conditions.

2.2 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A STREET TRADER'S LICENCE (EMPLOYEE): COLIN MCPHERSON, 67 COYLE AVENUE, DRONGAN

There was submitted a report dated 15 December 1997 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for grant of a Street Trader's Licence (Employee).

Having considered a letter of representation dated 5 December 1997 from Strathclyde Police and a letter (undated) from the applicant in support of his application (both circulated) it was agreed to grant the licence subject to the standard conditions.

**2.3 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A STREET TRADER'S LICENCE (EMPLOYEE):
KENNETH DILLON, 15 MUIR DRIVE, DARVEL**

There was submitted a report dated 15 December 1997 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for grant of a Street Trader's Licence (Employee).

Having considered a letter of representation dated 30 October 1997 from Strathclyde Police and a letter dated 22 December 1997 from the applicant in support of his application (both circulated), it was agreed to grant the licence subject to the standard conditions.

**2.4 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A SECOND HAND DEALER'S LICENCE: JOHN
CAMPBELL, 2 FULTON PLACE, DALRYMPLE**

There was submitted a report dated 15 December 1997 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for grant of a Second Hand Dealer's Licence.

It was agreed under Paragraph 3(2) of Schedule 1 to the Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982 to consider a letter of objection dated 6 November 1997 from Strathclyde Police, which had been received by the Licensing Authority outwith the period specified in Paragraph 3(i) (e) (iii) of Schedule 1 to the Act.

Having considered the above-mentioned letter of objection, together with representations from the Head of Planning and Building Control, the Trading Standards Service and the Environmental Health and Waste Management Service (all circulated), it was agreed to refuse the application on the grounds that the applicant was not a fit and proper person to hold a Second Hand Dealer's Licence.

**2.5 APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A SECOND HAND DEALER'S LICENCE: ALLAN
NIVEN, 110 WEST MAIN STREET, DARVEL**

There was submitted a report dated 15 December 1997 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for grant of a Second Hand Dealer's Licence.

Having considered a letter of representation dated 27 November 1997 from Strathclyde Police and a letter dated 17 December 1997 from the applicant in support of his application (both circulated) it was agreed to grant the licence subject to the standard conditions.
