LOCAL COMMITTEE GRANTS SCHEME

1. There was submitted a report dated 25 March 1999 (circulated) by the Director of Support Services which outlined the financial position in respect of grants received in the financial year 1998/99 together with a summary statement relating to outstanding applications for Community Grants received from local organisations.

1.1 Applications Approved (for the purpose specified on the application), viz:-

(a) Disability

St Marnock Playscheme - £50

The Committee noted that an interim award of £250 was made to the organisation under delegated powers by the Director of Support Services in consultation with the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee.

(b) Leisure

St Andrew's Glencairn Leisure Hour - Noted that an interim award of £16 was made to the organisation under delegated powers by the Director of Support Services in consultation with the Chair and Vice-Chair of the Committee.

(c) Pre-5's

Playdays Playgroup - £400

(d) Sport

Onthank Boys Club - £680

The Committee also agreed that the outstanding balance of the application (£200) would be considered at the next meeting on 6 April 1999 for funding from the 1999/2000 Community Grants Budget.

(e) Young People

- (i) Onthank After School Group - £1,187.31
