**APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A TEMPORARY PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT
LICENCE: IRVINE STRINGFELLOW, 58 LIGHTBURN ROAD, HALFWAY,
CAMBUSLANG, GLASGOW**

1. There was submitted a report dated 7 October 1998 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for the grant of a Temporary Public Entertainment Licence in respect of a funfair at Armour Street, Kilmarnock.

The Sub-Committee considered letters of representation dated 31 August, 30 September and 7 October 1998 from Strathclyde Police and a letter of objection dated 6 October 1998 from the Local Member (all circulated).

There were also circulated and considered (i) a letter of objection dated 7 September 1998 from a local resident; (ii) a letter of objection dated 7 October 1998 signed by two local residents; (iii) a letter of objection dated 8 October 1998 from a local resident; (iv) a petition received on 9 October 1998, signed by 213 local residents, objecting to application; and (v) a letter dated 8 October 1998 from the applicant in support of his application.

It was agreed to refuse to grant the licence as the land in question was not considered suitable for the conduct of the activity proposed, having regard to the possibility of undue public nuisance and in the interests of public order and safety.

The meeting terminated at 1316 hours.
