**CONSIDERATION OF APPLICATION**

2. **HEARING: APPLICATION FOR GRANT OF A STREET TRADER'S LICENCE: (Item 4, Page 82): EDWARD DALTON, FORMERLY OF 91 MAIN STREET, AUCHINLECK, NOW OF TOP LEFT FLAT 11 ARBUCKLE STREET, KILMARNOCK** - There was submitted a report dated 23 June 1999 (circulated) by the Director of Community Services on an application for a Street Trader's Licence.

There was also submitted a letter of representation dated 29 March 1999 from Strathclyde Police (circulated).

The Sub-Committee heard Superintendent S Keenan representing Strathclyde Police, in explanation of the police representations. It was noted that the applicant was not present or represented.

The police representatives then left the meeting to enable the Sub-Committee to take and consider legal advice on the matter.

Councillor Taylor, seconded by Councillor Weir, moved that the application be refused.

Councillor Stevenson, seconded by Councillor Hay, moved that the licence be granted subject to the standard conditions.
