EXCLUSION OF PRESS AND PUBLIC

1. The Committee resolved that under Section 50A(4) of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 as amended, the Press and public be excluded from the meeting for the following item of business on the grounds that it involved the likely disclosure of exempt information as defined in paragraph 9 of Schedule 7A of the Act.

SALE OF LAND AT QUEEN'S DRIVE, KILMARNOCK

2. There was submitted a joint report dated 30 July 1996 (circulated) by the Directors of Support Services and of Development Services recommending that the Council agree to sell land adjacent to the public highway at Queen's Drive, Kilmarnock to facilitate development of the adjoining sites.

It was agreed:

- (i) that the Council accept the offer of works to the value of £50,000 by the developer in exchange for a Disposition of the strips of land adjacent to Queen's Drive, Kilmarnock as indicated and outlined on the plan attached to the report, subject to the Development Services Committee declaring the ground concerned surplus to requirements for the public highway and to the Head of Legal Services reaching agreement as to the timing and details of the conveyance;
- (ii) that the Head of Legal Services conclude missives relating to the disposal; and
- (iii) that the Director of Development Services pursue with the developer the detailed arrangements for the road construction works and commission of such works.

The meeting terminated at 0908 hours.
