## <u>Implementation Strategic Plan: Engagement Programme</u>

Claire Kavanagh noted that the group approved a paper on the implementation programme for the Strategic Plan at the last meeting, and gave a progress update.

Going forward, engagement will continue about the strategic directions for 2021-30, with the aim that our partners, workforce and other stakeholders will have a greater understanding of our values based approach, wellbeing plan and strategic plan, and individuals will be identified to take on the role of communication champion. The aim will also be for all Service Improvement Plans and Locality Plans to have a really strong alignment to the Health and Social Care Strategic Plan.

3 sessions took place with the HSCP workforce led by Craig McArthur, with 83% of attendees saying the improved their understanding of the plan and 75% saying they felt understanding the plan is very important.

## Next steps:

- Head of Service will soon be agreeing a schedule for their portfolios to further SIP conversations.
- Locality groups will look to embed strategic direction and LOIP inequalities focus into planning and delivery
- The IJB/ HSCP is identifying how the innovation/ improvement network will be supported to improve practice and links to collaborative commissioning
